




She made Prince Daffyd do it, too, and *he* hadn't even been *saying* anything.


He didn't object then, either – though Amanita and I did. He just looked resigned and started doing it.


I can sort of see Commander Zaja's point actually. Or I could, if she weren't set on punishing someone along with Amanita – who is the one who always starts it.
